



- **Placement of Markers**

- Headstones are personal property. All monuments within the cemetery are the property of the lot owner. All care and upkeep of monuments is the responsibility of the owner. The city is not responsible for inadvertent scratches or chips that occur from routine maintenance.
- Flat markers level with ground are not allowed to have vases or containers.
- Only one raised marker is permitted per grave. (Cremation and Infant plots are not allowed to have a raised marker.)
- The owner or responsible party is responsible for the removal or replacement of a marker that must be moved for the excavation of a grave.
- Markers are subject to temperature extremes, sprinkler irrigation water and occasional nicks and chips from mowing equipment, it is recommended that raised markers have a rough nosed base or edge rather than a polished smooth surface.

All headstones are required to have a six-inch (6") mow strip around them. Monuments must be set by a private firm and must notify Cemetery Office Forty-Eight (48) hours before installation. Patrons are responsible for removal and re-installment of any marker or monument deemed oversized by the cemetery staff. All temporary memorials (plants, flags, wreaths) must be placed in a raised adjustable receptacle in the monument; a single shepherd hook may be placed adjacent to the concrete border.

Patrons are not allowed to plant trees, shrubs, or flowers on the cemetery grounds.

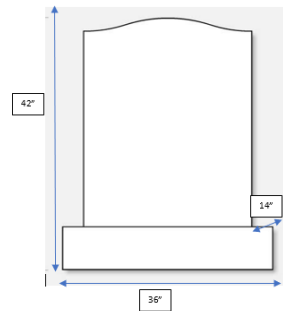


Monument/Grave Markers: Monument and grave markers will be installed by private firms. The Cemetery office must receive a minimum of forty-eight (48) hours' notice before installation. Installers are responsible for the removal of all excess debris and must restore the lot to its original condition. Patrons are responsible for removal and re-installment of any marker or monument deemed oversized by the cemetery staff.

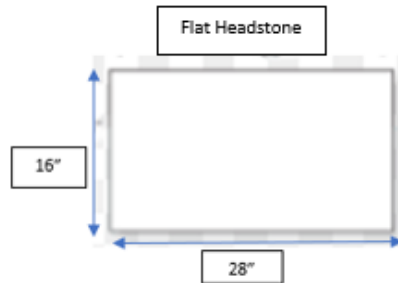


Veteran Markers are allowed, they can be attached to the back of an upright monument or set as a flat marker level with the ground.

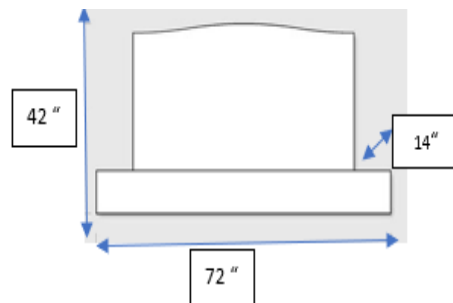
No fences, foot markers or other obstruction or installations except a headstone will be permitted in the cemetery. Consult with a monument manufacturer on monument materials suitable to handle conditions at the cemetery. Markers are subject to temperature extremes, sprinkler irrigation water and occasional nicks and chips from mowing equipment.

Upright monuments are allowed but may not be more than 42" high.

Cremation / Infant monuments are required to be flat.

Memorial Placement: All temporary memorials must be placed on a raised portion of the monument or in a permanent receptacle in the concrete border of the monument. A single shepherd hook may be placed adjacent to the concrete border. One shepherd hook per monument permitted (except for cremation/infant area). Receptacles must be of a type approved by Cemetery Staff.
